An ideal Sunday - bright and clear after the light fog lifted about 9 AM. The sea is a strange shade of lead gray and blue looking, quite dark and very iridescent over the deep ice. All day heading for Resolution Island - a barren, rocky, largely snow covered, waste, rising in low rolling contour not higher than a thousand feet at most, perhaps only five hundred. At evening, it is off our quarter and we are heading N. W. up Hudson Strait.


A good breeze all day but we stuck to the engine. This is a place of very high tides - about 28 feet - and the effect is most amazing at a great distance from land. The water swirls around in great eddies, swinging the ship with it in spite of her power and rudder - large areas are smooth where the water seems as though boiling over from a pot, to come upward and spread in all directions; and where opposing currents meet, the waves clash together and spray is thrown up in the air over areas of many yards, with a roaring noise like surf. An unusual sight which lasts about fifteen minutes during the change.

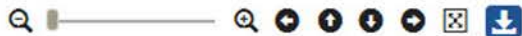

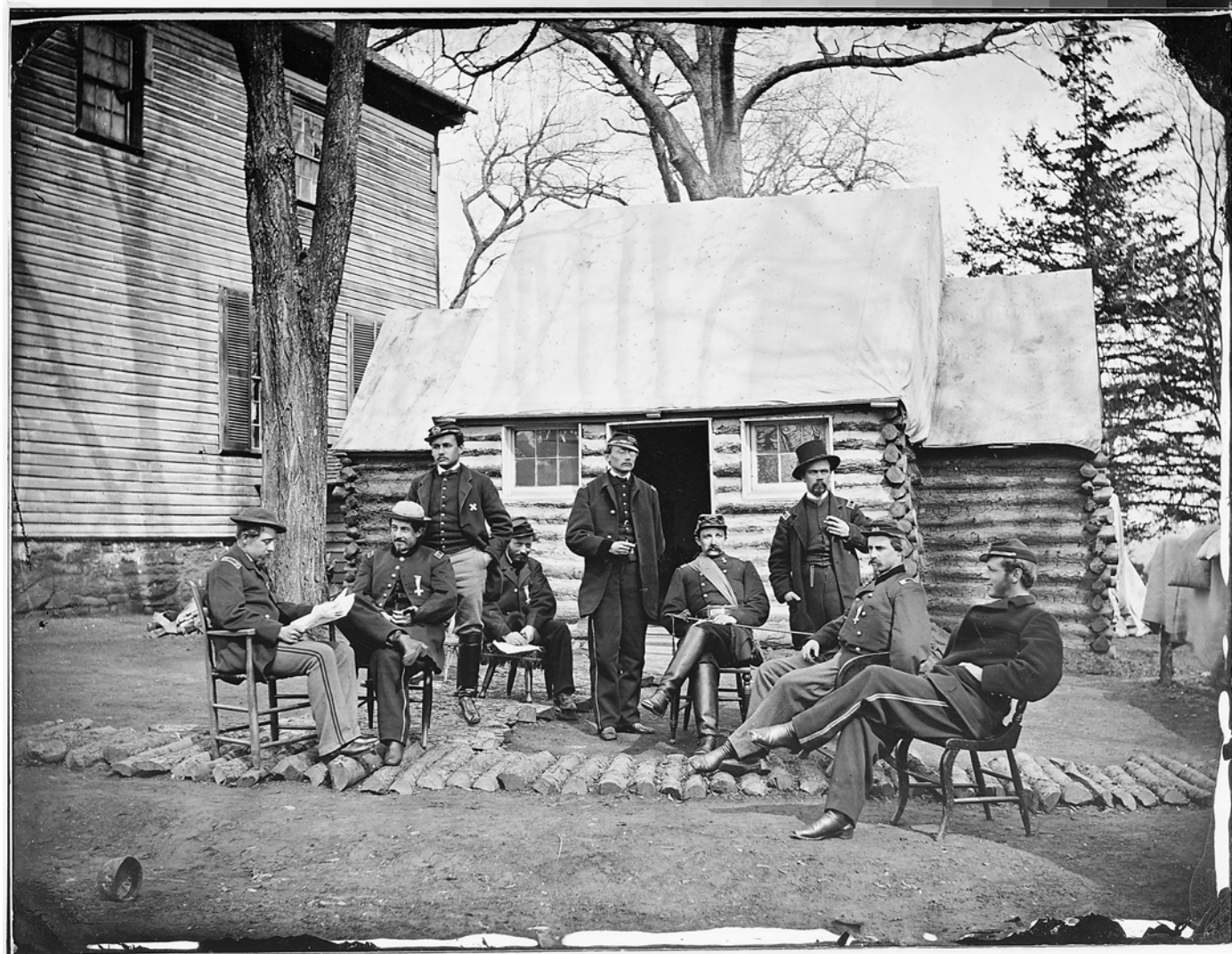



Letter to President Lyndon B. Johnson from Jackie Robinson



April 18, 1967

Dear Mr. President:

First, let me thank you for pursuing a course towards civil rights that no President in our history has pursued. I am confident your dedication will not only continue, but will be accelerated dependent on the needs of all Americans.

While I am certain your faith has been shaken by demonstrations against the Viet Nam war, I hope the actions of any one individual does not make you feel as Vice President Humphrey does, that Dr. King's stand will hurt the civil rights movement. It would not be fair to the thousands of our Negro fighting men who are giving their lives because they believe, in most instances, that our Viet Nam stand is just. There are hundreds of thousands of us at home who are not certain why we are in the war. We feel, however, that you and your staff know what is best and we are willing to support your efforts for a honorable solution to the war.

I do feel you must make it infinitely clear, that regardless of who demonstrates, that your position will not change toward the rights of all people; that you will continue to press for justice for all Americans and that a strong stand now will have great effect upon young Negro Americans who could resort to violence unless they are reassured. Sincerely yours, Jackie Robinson

assistance of USS 55, 56, 58, and L.A. Purpose of this station is to remain on the station and detect enemy aircraft approaching OKINAWA giving early warning and breaking up the defense with the CAP provided by land based air groups at OKINAWA. By daylight a CAP of 2 divisions plus one section as close cover is normally provided while at night a single P-51 is on station.

In the evening there was some air activity to the south and flash jet was heard at OKINAWA. However, our sector was quiet.
